Additionally, we will be holding the critical election for the 2016 Executive Committee as well as selling company inventory for the new campaign season.

**Annual Membership Meeting** (Sat, 27 Feb 2016). This meeting will run from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Fort Harrison Maintenance training room at that site. We'll be inviting several potential recruits to the meeting. Committee Reports will be presented as well as dealing w/any Old Business. - Turn Left onto Battlefield Park Drive
- Turn Right at Maintenance Way, the sign says authorized vehicles only.
