## 1<sup>st</sup> Sergeant's Column

The 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the American Civil War has now come to an end for F Co. w/the Surrender at Appomattox CH. The Company Commander in his column has already covered that event in terms of our participation w/Longstreet's Corps. The time has now arrived for us to work on developing our own events schedule and to seek other opportunities outside of Longstreet's Corps for our future satisfaction and historical participation in CW living history. I certainly appreciated and want to thank all of you who participated at Appomattox, that is, enduring all the unexplained and uncoordinated changes, but fortunately, the final surrender ceremony was very moving.

Endview Plantation (1-3 May 2015)- An excellent location w/easy access from I-64, plus if you haven't registered then you can be a walk-on participant! Plan on three battles along w/a fairly large crowd of visitors to the site. Weather forecast is good w/possibilities of showers on Fri, but dry on Sat-Sun w/temperatures in low 70's during the day w/temperatures during the night in the mid-50's. The Co. Commander and myself will be arriving on Fri afternoon, and will establish a campsite for all of you to be looking for. If arriving on Sat morning then be present in camp by 8:00AM without fail! Plan on bringing 100-120 rounds of ammunition as we will be participating in three battles, and we will once again be "campaigning" so ponchos or dog tents only for shelters. Participants signed up for event are Alexander, Johnathan, Butler, Disimone, Firth, Gammon, D., Hanson, Kulikowski, Martin and sons, and Vice. Directions to site:

Take I-64 East toward Newport News/Norfolk  
Take Exit 247- Yorktown/Lee Hall  
Turn left onto Jefferson Ave. (VA-143)  
Travel 1.2 miles to first stop light  
Turn left onto Yorktown Rd. (VA-238)  
Follow signs to Endview

Cold Harbor (30-31 May 2015)- As always part of our support of the National Park Service and especially Richmond National Battlefield. An excellent opportunity for living history on an original battlefield sight which is available to our co. due to our continuing support of NPS interpretative programs so let's turn out for this event!

Plan on 25 rounds of ammunition for this event w/supply of percussion caps including enough for clearing weapons prior to and after events. All ammunition along w/percussion caps must be stored in a paper bag or plastic bag w/your name on them which will be stored in a wooden ammunition box provided by the company. This is a specific NPS safety requirement, so no blank rounds or percussion caps in your cartridge box or cap pouch before or after events as you will be inspected by NPS Black powder Inspector for compliance. We will have a good campaigner campsite along w/available firewood and water for our use. Individuals signed up currently for this event are Alexander, Jack: Disimone, Firth, the Gammon's, Gunter, Kulikowski, Martin and sons, Touart and Vice. I will be arriving on Fri evening to establish a campsite. There is no registration fee for this event so turnout as once again you are getting access to an original CW site due to your F Co membership! Easy access to the site from I-64 w/directional signage.
